




Recognized as one of Canada's top businesswomen, Nancy was the 1999 Canadian Woman Entrepreneur of the Year in the Export category, awarded by the Joseph L. Rotman School of Management at the University of Toronto and the Bank of Montreal. She and SMART co-founder David Martin were awarded the 1999 Prairies Region Technology Entrepreneur of the Year Award, sponsored by Ernst and Young and a Manning Innovation Award in 2002.

In 2002-2003 Nancy was one of the nine members of the independent commission that reviewed Alberta's basic education system and produced *Every Child Learns, Every Child Succeeds*. Additionally, Nancy has spoken around the world on the topic of the 21st-century classroom today, sharing her perspectives on the successful integration strategies for interactive whiteboards in everyday teaching and learning.

In 2003 Nancy was awarded an honorary Doctor of Commerce degree from Saint Mary's University in recognition of her many business accomplishments.


